Chicano(a)/Latino(a) Studies provides an interdisciplinary curriculum and is designed to provide an awareness, knowledge, and appreciation of the Chicano(a)/Latino(a) experience. The minor addresses issues of language, history, culture, politics, economics, education, immigration and the creative expression of the Chicano(a)/Latino(a) presence in the United States. This new minor will greatly enrich any student's undergraduate degree. Its goal is to extend knowledge relevant to this growing ethnic group by examining its experiences in a social context and its interdependence with other populations by addressing interracial, intercultural, and international understanding. This new minor provides students with an essential understanding of the Chicano(a)/Latino(a) culture and will enable them to succeed in a diverse society. The CUP and Service Learning office promotes partnerships among students, faculty, staff and community members to improve the quality of life in our communities. One of the strategies used to achieve an improved community is *service learning*. Service learning combines academic learning objectives with meaningful work in the community. Students participating in service learning provide direct service to nonprofit and public organizations as a part of their requirements for academic credit, while faculty help them understand the connection between the tasks they perform and the academic course work. For example, health science students conduct health fairs and test homes for environmental hazards, sociology students help troubled teens to learn life skills, biology students supplement public schools with science demonstrations, etc. Students benefit from service learning courses through:

- hands-on use of skills and knowledge from a course
- interaction with people of diverse cultures and lifestyles
- leadership development opportunities
- gaining valuable career experience

The university offers both a minor and certificate in Women's Studies. There are four concentrations within the minor. For the General Women's Studies concentration, students complete three core Women's Studies courses (WSTD 100, 420, 425) plus 16 units of additional elective courses on issues concerning women and gender offered by other departments. For the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Concentration, students complete three core Women's Studies courses (WSTD 100, 420, 425), an additional required course (WSTD 103), plus eight units chosen from elective courses on Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender topics, and four units chosen from any Women's Studies course or cross-listed course. For the concentrations in Literature, Media and the Arts and the Society and Social Justice concentrations, students complete the core courses, plus 3 classes in their concentration area, plus one elective course. Not all electives can be applied to every concentration. When choosing electives contact the Coordinator to ensure electives apply.
